Advent: I am Enough, and Together We are More than Enough

Just as much as the season reminds us to be vigilant to the subtle signs of Christ's light as we once again anticipate and revel in the remarkability of Christ's birth and his return in the Second Coming, Advent is also about preparation for impactful giving – giving back to ourselves as well as to our communities. It's about recognizing where there is potential for energy renewal and restoration in our lives, in a world where we are often asked to operate on overdrive. Renewal and sustainability go hand in hand; to use our giving-energy sustainably means employing our awareness to our fullness as individuals first. In doing so, we can identify our actual capacities to give.

The theme for this year is *more than enough*. It is difficult in today's world to look for evidence of renewal and rebirth among very real threats of scarcity, depletion, and other forms of *not enough-ness*. For many of us, it can be especially hard to find enough-ness within our own bodies. The Advent season provides a context for this search because even in the darkest of hours, hopefulness for the future can be cultivated and energized anew when we pay close attention to our needs and the needs of our community.

We are all exhausted and overwhelmed by this year's own set of yet more unprecedented circumstances. But I am constantly and lovingly reminded by one of my dearest friends that our boundaries are bountiful. To give more than what we have, to exist in of a state of depletion, does not yield a sense of *more than enough*. The miracle, however, is that if each of us can identify and act upon the bounds and limitations of how much we can give, we can show up better for ourselves and those around us, authentically and less harmfully. If we give from a place of our embodied fullness, we are honoring our full humanity. We can then sustainably grow our capacity to give back to ourselves, as well as our communities and the land that we occupy.



This Advent season is a beautiful time to turn our attention inwards and renew our commitments to tangible, impactful giving. What spiritual preparations and mindsets are necessary for you to practice sustainable giving and receiving, even beyond this season? What values and boundaries will you lovingly recommit to as you prepare for the year ahead?

This is what sustainable stewardship means to me: Giving from a place of

our *personal definition of plenty*. Whatever that plentifulness may look like from person to person, is bountiful. And in this way, together we can be more than enough to do the collective healing work that needs to be done. |

October 2022 Minutes of the Vestry Meeting

Minutes of the September 21, 2022, meeting were approved. Financial Report for September 2022 was accepted.

Priest in Charge Update: Vestry broke into Private Session to respect privacy of those involved.

New Business:

Confirmands and Convention: St. John's will reimburse Lilly Mellies \$100 for confirmation training off-site. Lilly Mellies will be confirmed at Convention, a celebration will be in December.

December 4th will be Bishops Monnot's confirmation Sunday visit at St John's. One confirmand will be confirmed on December 4th, a reception will follow.

Fellowship/ Hospitality Budget Request Increase: Request to increase Hospitality Budget from \$600 per year to \$100 per month. Increase in cost of coffee, sweets, and paper products caused request. Vestry approved increase of \$100 per month for rest of 2022 fiscal year and will present to Finance Committee for 2023 budget an allowance of \$1200-\$1500 per year.

Snow Removal: Snow Removal service cost increased to a monthly rate rather than a service rate. Current company is Keith Cooper and Sons. Vestry approved remaining with Cooper and Sons at \$765 a month for 7 months.

Garbage Service: Garbage rates increased with Aspen Waste Systems. After extensive research and comparing prices and local services, Vestry approved remaining with Aspen at approximately \$70.00 per month, plus fees and taxes.

Baby Bump and Beyond Play Pen Donation Bin: Vestry approved Donation Bin for 1 month for Baby Bump supplies at St John's. Baby Bump and Beyond is the YSS non-profit that uses St. John's Attic space.

Christmas Services: There will be two services offered, 5pm and 9pm on December 24th. No services will be offered at St. John's on Sunday, December 25th.

All Saints Day, November 6th: Photos of those who have passed will be welcomed along the East window ledge. Photos of members and non-members are welcomed to be included.

Old Business:

Vestry Sunday Schedule is complete, and all dates have been filled. Audio/Video system installation has been completed.

Training to use the system will be at 8 am on Friday, October 21. All interested in being trained to use the system can inquire in the office.

Sr. Warden Report: A request for reimbursement was made for an item that was not a preapproved purchase and was not included in a line-item budget. This reimbursement request, and future ones like this, will not be approved or reimbursed. For reimbursement, the purchase needs to fall under previously approved spending.

Meeting adjourned at 8:27 pm with prayer.
